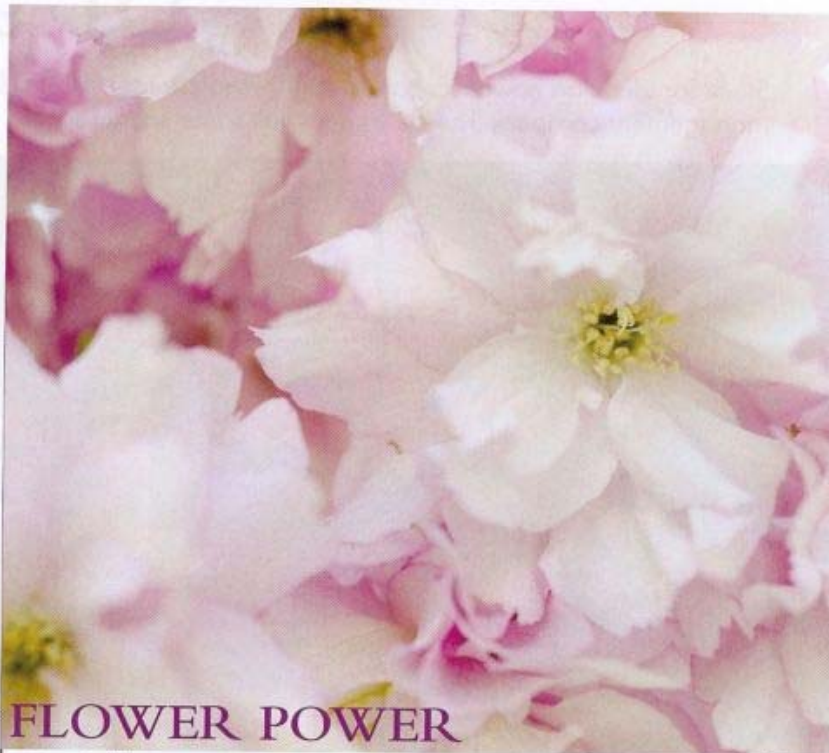

## All made up

**Q** I have a very round face - can I disguise this with makeup so I look good in all of my wedding photographs?

**A Sarah Brock says:** Absolutely! You need a matte bronzer (try Daniel Sandler Brazilian Bronze £20) and a small angled soft brush to contour your face and chisel your cheekbones. I use the Daniel Sandler small powder brush, £11. After foundation and powder, take the matte bronzer and apply a small amount under the cheek bone (in the hollow part of the cheek), sweeping up and out towards the hairline. Then, apply a small amount around the hairline and just underneath the jaw. This will add contour to the face and your photos will look amazing!



## FLOWER POWER

**Q** I really want to wear flowers in my hair, how can I do this without looking like a garden fairy?

**A Luci Foreman says:** Flowers can look very stylish in bridal hair, whether you've got fresh flowers or floral hair clips. Wear them behind the ear or on the side of a chignon for a beautiful elegant look. To fix fresh flowers, use grips and set with a lacquer.

## Keeping your Cool

**Q** I have really fine wispy hair that is prone to static and never seems to hold a style - how can I give it more body to create a really glamorous look?

**A Sarah Brock says:** Tigi Catwalk Root Boost (£9.90) will beef up limp hair and after a couple of weeks, should leave it feeling thicker, with more oomph. Alternatively, take a tip from the red carpet and invest in a hairpiece - whether you wear your style up or down, it can create a fuller, thicker look and blend seamlessly with your natural locks. One final tip - wash your hair the night before your wedding, as freshly-shampooed locks are more likely to be fine and flyaway, which can make it difficult to hold a style.

## Spot On

**Q** My skin is very temperamental - how do I disguise an unsightly spot on the day? I am really worried about last-minute break-outs.

**A Luci Foreman says:** A surprise spot is your worst wedding nightmare, but nobody need know it's there! I recommend swirling a fluffy eye shadow brush onto a stiff concealer and lightly tickling it onto the blemish - this will blur out the redness. Be careful though, try not to overdo it with too much of the product. Then, finish with a dusting of powder for the perfect camouflage.
